Rev. John Francis Carney Retreat Master

He was born on June 25, 1946 in New York City to Irish Immigrants. He received a Catholic Education at the hand of the Sisters of Charity and the Brothers of the Holy Cross. After graduating from Providence College in Political Science. Served 20 yrs. in the US Army as an Airborne and Ranger in Germany, Korea, and Vietnam; with a Masters of Military Arts and Science he served in many locations in the US including Fort Leavenworth and the Pentagon; retired as a Lieutenant Colonel on 8-1-1987.



Went to Mount Angel Seminary in St. Benedict, Oregon, and was ordained a priest of the Archdiocese of Santa Fe on May 18, 1991. 1st assignment was as a parochial vicar at St. Thomas Aquinas Parish in Rio Rancho, NM.

After one year, he was assigned as pastor of Holy Child Parish in Tijeras, NM and served in that capacity for ten years. In addition to his assignment as pastor, he was appointed as the vocation director for the archdiocese in April, 1993. He served as VD until June 2002, and became pastor of Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish in Los Alamos, NM. Finally, in 2013, He was assigned as pastor of the Church of the Incarnation in Rio Rancho until his retirement in 2016. As Pastor he brought new vigor to spiritual life to the parishes and enhanced the beauty of the churches facilities and grounds. His care for the young and the elderly, the sick and the dying, the joyful and the suffering inspired the entire community where ever he was assigned.

Fr John Carney brings with him a wealth of life experiences and strong spiritual and moral convictions. The rights of the unborn and pro-life issues have been two of his passions; another passion outside of his priestly vocation is his love of sports.
